*National Picture

- *Future in mind Dept of Health/NHS England 2015
- *1 in 10 children need support or treatment for mental health problem
- *75% of mental health problems in adult life start by the age of 18
- *Early intervention avoids young people falling into crisis.

- *Significant gaps in what we know
- *Treatment gap
- *Difficulties in access
- *Complexity of current commissioning
- *Access to crisis, out of hours and liaison psychiatry
- *Issues in vulnerable groups

*Complexity and severity of the current challenges

- *9.6% or nearly 850,000 children aged 5-16 yrs have a mental disorder
- *7.7 % or nearly 340,000 children aged 5-10 yrs have a mental disorder
- *11.5% or about 510,000 young people aged 11-16 yrs have a mental disorder

- *Conduct disorders 5.8%
- *8,398
- *Anxiety 3.3%
- *4,778
- *Depression 0.9%
- *1,300
- *Hyperkinetic disorder (severe ADHD) 1.5% 2,172

*Common mental health issues in children and young people

- *CPFT have experienced a year on year increase in the demand for specialist CAMH on-call staff for self-harm assessments in the acute hospitals.
- *Commissioned voluntary and community sector organisations delivering mental health services also report an increase in self-harm and suicidal thoughts amongst young people.

*Cambridgeshire and Peterborough

- *Accepted referrals 287
- *38 children and young people required urgent assessment.
- *Numbers waiting = 1076
- *ADHD 264
- *ASD 224

- *Increased investment to change services
- *Non recurrent funding
- *Developing a Cambridgeshire wide strategy by Sept 2015
- *Transformation Programme
