Social Communication difficulties

What are social communication difficulties?

A child or young person would be described as having social communication difficulties if they struggle to understand the usual social aspects of communication, which most people take for granted. This causes them difficulty in relating to others and impacts on their ability to form relationships. Individuals with Autism have social communication difficulties as part of their condition, but will have some additional difficulties such as repetitive mannerisms and a narrow range of interests.
