

What benefits are available and what can I get help?

There are a number of Government -funded welfare benefits aimed to support those who may need help. Some are particularly relevant to families with children and young people who have additional needs, special needs, medical conditions and / or disabilities. Many families are unaware of what they or their children may be entitled to claim. Not all of them are paid according to what you earn or the savings you have.

There are some that are commonly accessed by families whose children have additional needs, special needs. You do not need a diagnosis but you may need to explain how your child's needs are more than those of other children the same age.

Disability Living Allowance (DLA)
Personal Independence Payment (PIP)
Universal Credit
Carer's Allowance
Tax credits
Help with Council Tax & rates'
